

**MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF GRANT-IN-AID COMMITTEE**  
**HELD ON 17.11.11**

A meeting of the GIA Committee was held on 17.11.11 at 02.30 P.M. under the chairmanship of Director (WCD) to consider the GIA cases under the schemes of Ministries of Social Justice & Empowerment, and Women & Child Development, Govt. of India, for the year 2011-12.

The meeting was attended by the following officers:-

The Distt. Officers/ representatives from the Distt. Officers attended the meetings, who had carried out the scrutiny and inspection of the GIA proposals which were, project location-wise, falling in their respective jurisdiction. They brought and presented the cases before the GIA Committee along with summary containing brief findings and results on the cases.

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## **COMMON OBSERVATIONS FOR RECOMMENDED CASES:**

The GIA Committee observed that the above listed cases are recommended to Ministry of Social Justice & Empowerment, Govt. of India and Ministry of Women & Child Development, Govt. of India with the following common observations:-

1. In view of the fact that the Ministry of Social Justice & Empowerment, Govt. of India has decided State-wise notional allocation under different GIA schemes, the amount of GIA for the recommended cases may be decided as per the proportion of actual grant disbursed last year.
2. The quantum amount of GIA may be decided by the Recommendation Committee/Project Sanctioning Committee at Govt. of India after looking into the utilization of the previous grants.
3. The sanction be based strictly in accordance with norms of the scheme as applicable to the respective case.

## **SPECIFIC OBSERVATIONS**

### **ASSOCIATION FOR ADVANCEMENT & REHABILITATION OF HANDICAPPED (AAROH)**

The said project is recommended by the Grant-In-Aid Committee subject to following conditions:

1. That the organization submits to the Ministry through the GIA Committee of the Deptt. of Women & Child Development and Social Welfare, Govt. of NCT of Delhi, the required satisfactory certificates duly signed by the authorized signatory to the effect that:
  - (i) Stipend claimed is in respect of dependent beneficiaries whose annual family income does not exceed Rs. 1.00 lakh and
  - (ii) No user charges or donations or any charges were or are recovered or received from the beneficiaries who are from families that are below the poverty line.
  - (iii) No transport charges or donations for the purpose of transportation of children were or are recovered or received from the parents of any children
2. That the organization submits to the Ministry of Social Justice & Empowerment, Govt. of India through the GIA Committee of the Deptt. of Social Welfare and Women & Child Development, Govt. of NCT of Delhi details( names, father's name, address etc.) of these beneficiaries catered to by the organization who are from the BPL families, alongwith the copies of the evidences obtained by the organization in support of the BPL claim of the beneficiaries.

The above detailed GIA proposals of the above mentioned NGO under the GIA scheme of 'Assistance for Prevention of Alcoholism and Substance (Drugs) Abuse and for Social Defense Services' were brought and presented before the GIA Committee by the Distt. Officer (West) for their consideration for the year 2011-12.

The GIA Committee returned the GIA cases to the Distt. Officer and deferred the consideration of these GIA proposals to the next meeting/meetings with the directions to the DSWO(West) to get another inspection conducted by the O/o DSWO(West) taking into cognizance the findings of the Enquiry conducted

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on 24th July, 2010 by her Distt. Team in respect of a complaint vide letter No. F.22-8(27)/2009-DD-II dated 7<sup>th</sup> July, 2010 received in the Department of WCD, Govt. of Delhi from the Ministry of Social Justice & Empowerment, Govt. of India. The DSWO(West) has been directed to present the cases in the next meeting/meetings alongwith this consolidated report on the NGO.

The GIA Committee also directed the VAC to further pursue the matter of Audit of the NGO with the concerned authorities by making correspondence with them.

### OTHER DECISIONS

1. The Grant-In-Aid Committee observed that several NGOs time and again evince interest and efforts through their GIA proposals in the field of prevention, treatment and rehabilitation of patients of drugs/ substance/ alcoholism abuse under the related GIA scheme of the Ministry of Social Justice & Empowerment, Govt. of India namely ‘Prevention of Alcoholism and Substance (Drug) Abuse’. However, it is observed that such NGOs often do not have the staff equipped with the skills required to deal with the issues related to prevention, treatment and rehabilitation of such patients.

The GIA Committee directed the VAC to write to the Regional Resource Centre of the Delhi state namely ‘Society for Promotion of Youth & Masses’ to take the matter of skill upgradation of the personnel of such potentially effective NGOs in the field ( but not aided by the Government) after identifying the same at its own level, while keeping the Deptt. of WCD informed about the developments in its efforts for the said purpose on monthly basis.

2. The GIA Committee also observed that the social menace of the Female Foeticide in the country has caught concern and attention of some NGOs in Delhi State as well. Some NGOs have been found applying in GIA schemes of the Ministry of WCD, Govt. of India to deal with the ghastly trend of Female Foeticide in Indian society. However, the applicant NGOs regrettably lack the desired competence, resource, facilities and expertise to creatively diagnose, assess and chalk out the effective solutions for this social issue.

The GIA Committee directed the VAC to write to the Chairperson, Mission Convergence, Samajik Suvidha Sangam Society to apprise about the matter and to advise & request to take up programmes, alongwith its other activities at its esteemed and competent Gender Resource Centers, which should be designed and targeted to cater to the prevention of female foeticide in Delhi State.

- (ii) Following relevant points on eligibility & experience requirements stipulated in the scheme & other guidelines:
  - ‘Guidelines For Assisting NGO/Voluntary Organizations’ of the Ministry of Social Justice & Empowerment, Govt. of India which states that “In order to be eligible for assistance, a Voluntary Organization should have been registered for a period of at least two years and should have been actively working in its sector for a period of two years. Such projects will not be taken up for assistance where the activities are proposed to commence after the project is sanctioned and funds released by the Ministry”;
  - “The Organization should possess proven credentials and capabilities to handle such projects”

  - 'Guidelines For Assisting NGO/Voluntary Organizations' of the Ministry of Social Justice & Empowerment ,Govt.of India which states that "In order to be eligible for assistance, a Voluntary Organization should have been registered for a period of at least two years and should have been actively working in its sector for a period of two years. Such projects will not be taken up for assistance where the activities are proposed to commence after the project is sanctioned and funds released by the Ministry";

**PREVENTION OF ALCOHOLISM AND SUBSTANCE (DRUGS) ABUSE**

- It should have resources, facilities and experience for undertaking the programme.
- As conveyed by the Ministry of Social Justice & Empowerment, Govt. of India, "under the revised scheme of Prevention of Alcoholism & Substance (Drug) Abuse,, which came into effect from 1.10.2008, Counseling & Awareness Centres have been merged with the Integrated Rehabilitation Centre for Addicts (IRCA), therefore, funding for maintenance of the Counseling & Awareness Centres would not be possible under the revised scheme".

**FOR SOCIAL DEFENSE SERVICES**

- The objectives of the scheme are:
  - To meet urgent needs falling within the mandate of the Ministry which cannot be met under its regular schemes.
  - To support such initiatives of an innovative/pilot nature in the area of welfare and empowerment of the Ministry's target groups, as cannot be supported under its regular schemes.
- The Organisation should have at least two years of experience of working in the related area or should

Keeping the following into consideration:

- Findings reported by the inspecting team and other inputs given by the respective Distt. Officers, as briefly noted against each case;
- Following relevant points on guiding principles and eligibility & experience requirements stipulated in the scheme:
  - The organization should have experience of working in that programme or related area or should show evidence of competence to take up the proposed scheme.
  - The organisation should have been in existence for at least two years before it is eligible for applying for grant-in-aid under any scheme. However, an exception of this rule may be considered in areas where the Central/State Govt. proposes to promote Voluntary effort.
  - It should be well managed stable organisation with facilities, resources and personnel to undertake welfare

- It should not be run for profit to any individual or body of individuals.
- It should have a properly constituted Managing Body with its powers/duties and responsibilities clearly defined and laid down in a written Constitution.
- Its services should be open to all without distinction of caste, religion or language.
- It should be possible to relate the number of years of useful work the organization has done with the quantum of grant that should be given.
- Projects not covered by any of the existing schemes of the Department of Women and Child Development including the Central Social Welfare Board (CSWB).

- (ii) Para no.12 of the scheme which states that  
 “The scheme is proposed to be implemented through Public Sector Organizations, District Rural Development Agencies, Federation, Cooperatives and voluntary Organization - Non-Government Voluntary Organizations working in rural areas with legal status as a society registered under the societies Registration Act of 1860 or under the Corresponding State Acts. Recipient of financial assistance under STEP are required to be bodies, Organizations or agencies working in rural areas, although their Headquarters may be located in the urban area. They must be registered at least for 3 years (experience/existence in the sector concerned) at the time of approaching for assistance. Implementing agencies will also identify a set of link agencies, which would facilitate the implementation of the project through their expertise, resources and experience. Link agencies would also include voluntary Organizations; active in the field of employment and women’s development. While selecting non government organizations as implementing agencies, it would be ensured that the selected organizations have adequate infrastructure and technical expertise in the sector, financial soundness with facilities, resource experience and administrative capabilities for undertaking the project”;
- (iii) Objectives/Activities of Gender Resource Centres (GRCs) :
- To act as a catalyst for making Delhi safe for women through social legal and economic empowerment
  - To improve Health of women
  - To impart skill for specific trades and to provide forward and backward linkages enabling women to be a part of productive work force obtain good remuneration.
  - To provide facilities with linkages for school drop outs to return to mainstream and to provide non formal functional literacy
  - To establish a mechanism for linking existing government schemes for women and to enable women to access it better.
