Another meeting of the GIA Committee was held on 13.12.12 at 03.00 P.M. under the chairmanship of Director (WCD) to consider the GIA cases under the schemes of Ministries of Social Justice & Empowerment, and Women & Child Development, Govt. of India, for the year 2012-13.
